Students entering with a master's degree from another institution may request a waiver of the thesis requirement. It is generally expected that students with an approved thesis waiver will complete the program in the same number of years as students without an approved thesis waiver.

Students entering the program having completed graduate coursework at another institution may request a waiver of specified coursework. A maximum of three courses may be waived due to comparable coursework being completed at another university.

All students admitted to the doctoral graduate program are offered a graduate assistantship that qualifies them for waiver of university tuition in addition to a minimum 10.5-mo stipend of \$12,000. Graduate Teaching Assistants and Graduate Service Assistants receive an exemption equal to approximately 71% of assessed tuition. Graduate Research Assistants receive a 100% exemption of assessed tuition. Graduate Assistants who are not Mississippi residents will receive a 100% exemption of the additional charges assessed for non-resident tuition. For the 2018-2019 academic year, the amount of charges in excess of the tuition exemption is \$1,200 per semester for Graduate Teaching Assistants and Graduate Service Assistants. During the summer enrollment period, the fee charges are assessed on a per credit hour basis with students needing to assessed on a per credit hour basis with students needing to take at least three credit hours during the first summer term.

The first cohort of students was accepted for the 2014 -2015 year including both new incoming students as well as students from our terminal master's program, which has now been discontinued. Although our first three cohorts were accepted at the same time, they have been broken up here to more accurately portray the size of each cohort. In future years we anticipate accepting 4-6 students per year. \*The tuition waiver provided to students varies by funding source. Most students are funded through teaching assistantships, which cover 71% of tuition, with the remaining 29% being charged at the in-state rate. See program costs, above, for more information.
