

## TENURE-TRACK ASSISTANT PROFESSOR POSITION IN CLINICAL PSYCHOLOGY

The Department of Psychology at Mississippi State University is seeking applications for a 9-month, tenure track position at the rank of Assistant Professor beginning August 16<sup>th</sup>, 2017. The successful applicant will become a core member of our Clinical Psychology Ph.D. program. Established in 2013, the Clinical Program has been approved for an initial accreditation site visit by the American Psychological Association in the Winter 2016 cycle.

Preferred applicants will have completed an APA-accredited doctoral program and internship in Clinical Psychology at the time of appointment. We are seeking candidates with an established program of scholarly research. The research area of specialization in Clinical Psychology is open, though adult-focused applicants are preferred. Clinical faculty teach undergraduate and graduate courses and supervise graduate student research. The successful candidate will be expected to pursue professional licensure in Mississippi, and post-doctoral supervision can be arranged if required.

Mississippi State University has an enrollment of approximately 21,000 students. The Department of Psychology houses 20 tenured/tenure track faculty as well as 500 undergraduate majors and 40 doctoral students. Located in the “Golden Triangle Regional” technology and manufacturing corridor of the state, we offer a diverse, welcoming, and vibrant community with a rich variety of cultural and recreational activities. Mississippi State University was named a “Great College to Work For” by the Chronicle of Higher Education in 2016.

Mississippi State University is ranked by the Carnegie Foundation as a higher research activity institution, and is designated by the National Science Foundation as a top 100 research university. The Department has a number of existing ties to the University’s neuroimaging research center, which houses a 3.0T MRI and an EEG laboratory, and to the Social Science Research Center which serves to unite social science researchers across the university. The Department also houses a Cognitive Science Ph.D. program, and collaboration between the Clinical and Cognitive areas provides for unique research opportunities. Applicants whose research complements existing strengths in the department and across the university are particularly encouraged to apply.
